

TN Heat Fund Raising

The TN Heat is 501c3, therefore the Board of Directors decides where the funds are to be allotted based on the recommendations of the Heat Fund Raising Coordinator. The funds raised are NOT to be viewed as personal earnings and therefore cannot be refunded back to the player/family. Should a player decide they want to quit or they leave the Heat Sports program, those funds cannot be refunded to the family or player. Again, it is at the discretion of the board on how funds are forwarded into player's accounts. With that in mind, we are a Christian organization that will apply Christian values and ethics to do above and beyond what is fair and just to the families that are working hard to fund raise for their athlete.

What's available?

Bridgestone Arena - (Delaware Corp)

Municipal Auditorium

Sounds games

Pending - CSM Corp -LP Field, Bridgestone Arena and other venues (details coming soon)

How often can you work? : It depends on what events are available for that week or month, but generally as much as you like.

Are funds shared with the team or others? : For this type fundraising, the earnings are allotted **only** to those who worked the events.

What can I use the money for? : Please check with your coach. Each sport is different. Generally it can be used for fees, gear, uniforms, and often lodging expenses.

What happens if I raise more money than needed? : Again you need to check with your coach. Generally, if you don't have any extra expenses, funds will roll over to the next season.

Who do I contact about getting my funds to my coach? : All of the accounting is managed by the Heat accountant, Kristena Savley. Once your fees are due, please contact Kristena directly and she will forward whatever funds are available "to date" into the correct sports account and she will then email the coach to tell them that funds have been transferred.

Options to Fund Raise

(Family and friend can work with you to help raise funds)

Municipal Auditorium

Min age: 15

Pay \$7.25 hr

Hour commitment 5-6.5

Available events are about 1-3 per month – All year

Sounds Games

Min age: 16

Pay 8% commission on what the stand sells or your portable, if you aren't in a stand

Hour commitment – Group Stand manager to arrive 30 min prior to everyone else

5-6.5 Hrs

Events: Sounds home games. April- Sept 6th

Responsible for cash and accounting of your drawer, if assigned, or to serve concessions to patrons after orders are taken

Bridgestone Arena – on hold until fall 2015

Min age: 18

Pay \$55 per event or 10% commission, whichever is greater

Hour commitment - 4.5 - 10+ hrs (Bonus is offered for longer event hours)

Events - All events including the Preds games season - All Year

(Staff is responsible for all stock accounting and accounting of cash)

What we do....

For all venues, we sell basic concessions. It can be extremely busy for all of the locations. If you are on register, you will be required to sell canned beer. (Appropriate training is available and is required for Bridgestone)

If there is a cash shortage in your drawer, then that shortage will be deducted.

All funds received are authorized by the Board of Directors to go into players accounts based on the accounting recommendations of the Fundraising Coordinator.

Generally we receive the earned funds within 30 days, if not sooner. Bridgestone has had many issues this past year and has taken much longer.

Individuals can request to be in a portable ice cream or Icee booth at Sounds games and Bridgestone.

Once you confirm that you want to work an event you must commit to attending and fulfilling your obligation. If you can't make the shift, please find a replacement for your spot and contact the Fund Raising Coordinator.
